Union County Deputy State Supervisors of Elections

This Board met in regular monthly session at 1-30 P.M. this adte.

Members present, Chairman Chas. E. Moran, O. L. Bonham, James Mackan and Luther Liggett- Clerk Hazen.

Chairman called on Citizens of the County being present, they evidently being concerned about the future change likely to take place in the Election Voting Places of Union County

Presiding Judge and Republican Com. 'Man Frank L. Baldwin also F Seers, both from Liberty South Township and Voting Precinct. (Seers being Dem. Com. 'Man) Addressed this Board, calling attention to the need of retaining their Voting Place at Peoria same being as much as four or five miles closer for some of their Voters who find it very inconvenient to get as far as Peoria, they both feeling that if the Precinct is combined at Raymond the larger Voting Precinct several of their Voters will not be able to Vote any year. Mr. Dillon from Liberty No. expressed himself as opposed to any combined Precincts for Liberty.) Following full discussion by this Board relative to the prospective changes in the Voting Places as Listed by The Marysville Tribune, based on last Nov. Elections Vote for Governors Cooper and White, The Chairman informed the Gentlemen that while The Tribune had a right to print said list it had not been passed on Officially by this Board and following such action by this Board they would serve due Notice on each Precinct so effected when if according to the New Law governong such changes, if Twelve Voters from said Precinct call in person this Board is dutybound to consider their claims before deciding to effect the change in their Voting Precinct.

The men stated they were misled by the article in Tribune, taking same as an Official Notice relative to the changes.

This Board express their sepezzate wish (each) to consider the matter of changing any of the Voting Places until next regular meeting.

Mr. Moran again informed the members that Union Township Voters had called on him at his home relative to mentioned change in Union South Precinct South. They making the same claim this Board received from Liberty So. Precinct. Some in this Precinct being as much as six miles from Milford Center., the Voting Place for Union North. Member Liggett read aloud Sec. 4785 -22 and 23. treating on Changing Voting Places.

The Motion was made by Member Liggett, that this Board go on record as favoring the necessary changes in accord with the Law governing same and following further enquiry and investigation to act on same at next meeting on Tuesday Mch. 3rd. 1931 Seconded by Member Bonham, Vote being taken resulting unanimous in favor of such action.

There being no other business this Board Destroyed all "Ballotts" from Nov. 4th. Election 1930 same being held on order of Sec. of State, that a recount on Lieut. Governor might be had if so ordered. Order to destro having been received earlier this month

The Clerk was ordered to issue orders on County Auditor for Compensation for each Member and Clerk of this Board. Members each \$19.00 Clerk \$28.50 The Board Members on Investigating Election Equipment returned by the forty Precincts, reported over a Dozen that failed to use Cord and Sealing Wax or seal Poll Book Envelopes after placing used Poll Books in same. They recommend that each Board be advised to Follow Printed Instructions more fully in above and checking up their Tally Sheets with said Poll Books, Returning Poll Books to the

proper officials as marked on front of envelopes, which makes some change over former Elections. At the State Elections at least ,one Complete Poll Tally Book should be delivered to The Clerk of Common Please Court, (in regular envelope provided for same and said envelope should be well sealed as said Book is to be held by County Clerk in this unopened condition in case a recount is ordered by Sec. of State.

There being no other business on motion by Mackan ,seconded by Bonham this Board adjourned to meet Tuesday the 3rd. of March at 1-30 P.M. 1931

This Board meeting in regular Monthly Session on this date more particularly that the matter of any contemplated change in Election or Voting Places also any other business to come before it. Present all Members and Clerk.

The Matter of Reorganization of this Board to be brought about next May was discussed, while the members were of the opinion that Member Moran and Clerk Hazen's time as Member and Clerk of this Board was officially extended by the New Election Laws under date of April 1930 Clerk instructed to obtain word accordingly or otherwise from Sec. of State soon as possible.

There being no Citizens present to address this Board the matter of changing Voting Places of the County in keeping with Total Vote cast at the Last Gen. Election which was Nov. 4th. 1930 On motion by Liggett seconded by Bonham and carried the Clerk was instructed to Post Notice of contemplated change in each of the Voting Precincts effected. ie; Allen North, Jackson North, Jerome East, Taylor South, Unionville Ctr. Leesburg East. Marysville Fourth Ward B. Richwood to be reduced one Voting Precinct. Washington West. ~~and~~ York East to be enlarged from the West Precinct.

Following the reading of copy of Letter from Union South Precinct to Sec. of State and the Reply from said Office, this Board decided to lay the matter on the table indefinitely. It might be well to note here the change is not being made at this time due to Union South Petition by about ~~many~~ <sup>nearly</sup> Voters that some would not be able to go the distance of six miles to vote. Liberty South treated likewise at this time.

The following bills on motion by Mackan seconded by Moran and carried were ordered paid.

on this the 7th. of April, Tuesday -1-30 P.M. 1931.

Present Chairman Charles E. Moran,  
O.L. Bonham, James Mackan and Luther Liggett Members and Clerk L.W. Hazen.

There being several Citizens, of  
this Union County, present they evidently representing the Townships in  
which this Board had posted Notice of Change or Combining the Voting  
Places of the County in keeping with Ohio Law Sec. #4785-22-23- 24- .  
Chairman Moran requested the Clerk to call the Roll as to the Township  
so effected or Posted resulting as follows.

Allen Township, North to be combined with Allen South at Allen Ctr. There  
being no Citizens present from this Township at this time, the Clerk  
informed the Board that Citizen Thomas and Brown from Allen North had  
called on him relative to proposed change expressing their opinion  
that the distance of about five miles would be too far for some Voters  
who would be compelled to go to Allen Ctr.

Jackson North or Jackson Typ. to be combined, none present,  
Unionville Center, to be combined with Darby South as Unionville Ctr. had  
less than 100 Votes cast at the last General Election, no Voters present  
to object, word from Mayor Yealey and one or two others there that if  
it would reduce the Election Expense materially they would not oppose  
said change.

Paris Township, combining East with West, none present with no word ex-  
pressed.

Taylor Township, South with North Precinct, none present.

Jerome Township, East with West, Citizens Fry, Shover and Brock and others  
being present, entered their protest and presented A Petition objecting  
to the combining of the two Jerome Precincts, said petition signed by 192  
Citizens living in Jerome East Precinct. Following discussion Mr.

PROPOSED CONSOLIDATION OF VOTING PRECINCTS IN  
RICHWOOD CORPORATION.

OHIO LAW #4785 - 22-23- Demands a Vote of not less than 250 Votes to Precincts. Richwood's Vote at last General Election Totaled just 800 for the four precincts.

Precinct North the same as present Richwood North A and bounded as follows: *To be known as First Precinct.*

Beginning at the North corporation line and the intersection of North Franklin Street; thence Southerly along the center of North Franklin Street to the intersection of the alley between Blagrove and Ottawa Streets; thence Easterly along said alley between Blagrove and Ottawa Streets to the East corporation line.

Precinct South described as follows: *Second Precinct*

Beginning at the East corporation line and the intersection of the alley between Blagrove and Ottawa Streets; thence Westerly to the center of Franklin Street; thence Southerly along the center of Franklin Street to the intersection of Franklin and Bomford Streets; thence Westerly along the center of West Bomford Street to the corporation line.

Precinct West: *Third Precinct.*

Beginning at the North corporation line at the intersection of North Franklin Street; thence with the center of Franklin Street Southerly to the intersection of South Franklin Street with Bomford Street; thence Westerly along the center of Bomford Street to the intersection of the corporation line.

The Law giving Absent Voters opportunity to apply for Ballots until Midnight Sat. before Election, is questioned by this Board, seemingly being unfair in the HOUR specified, not being convenient for Officers or for the customary form of carrying Ballots for Absent Voters here for this School and District Election. Purchasing the Ballots for Union County at ~~some~~ much or stated price per Book, it would make the duplicate Books necessary for the entire County very expensive at best. The Clerk wishes here to go on record of favoring the purchasing of Ballots by The Thousand with a fixed price for putting them into Books as desired, which is done in surrounding Counties of Delaware and Madison at more than 50 % saving to the County. Fifty Thousand Ballots would be sufficient no doubt for this Election on Nov, 3rd. 1931 I understand the average price over the State completed in Book Form is not over \$10.00 M or \$500.00 for Union County at a saving of over \$300.00 this Election.

There being present from Magnetic Springs, Mr. W. Miller, claiming to be Dem. Committeeman for said place, he protested the appointments of Mr. O. N. Bell, as Pres, Judge and J. H. Ballard as Judge and Ruth Brown as Clerk, stating Mr. Bell not being fully elected or appointed Chairman had not the power to even recommend such appointments. # TIME IS SHORT TO FILE REPORT

CLERK OF BOARD OF ELECTIONS STATES FILING OF EXPENSE ACCOUNTS NECESSARY.

Many of the public officials elected in Union county on November 3rd still remain unqualified for the positions, according to L. W. Hazen, clerk of the board of elections.

In order to be legally qualified for a public office after being elected to that office, a person must file with the board of elections an expense account of the campaign. The filing of such an account is required under the corrupt practices act, and not only do persons who fail to file such an account make themselves liable for prosecution but they are also considered as not legally qualified to assume office.

It is said that public business which such public officials transact might be successfully challenged in court due to the fact the official is not legally qualified to assume his duties.

There are only a few days during which the expense accounts can be filed. The account is required whether or not any money was spent on the campaign. It must be sworn to before a notary public and filed with the board of elections in order to be legal.

All candidates for office, whether successful or not, are required to file an expense account under the corrupt practices act—which provides heavy penalties for those who do not comply with its provisions.
