The four Invoices from Col. Blank Book Company for above and Primary Elec. Blanks for Candidates to use we find to total \$81.10 less Credit on Mch. 19th. for said Blanks returned \$11.88 same representing an evident overstock. Not receiving an itemized statement to date from above Company the Board advised to hold for such.

Comparing the Sample Sheet for New Cash Book the Board were unable to find any or sufficient change to justify discontinuing our Cash Book now in use and evidently good for a few years.

The Clerk reported to this Board the special request he had received from Atty. Generals Office for a complete List of all Candidates at last Nov. 5th. Election who had or had not filed their Corrupt Practice Report. The Atty. Gen. ruling that each candidate voted for must file said blank promptly. The completed report being sent in as request we have received the necessary signed blanks from a large majority of the candidates.

The Clerk reported to the Board that he was well received at the Offices of Sec. of State and Atty General when calling for more information relative to the New Election Laws and Rulings.

This is hard to believ after reading "Pro- cedure in Booth" Sec. 4785-209 which without doubt covers this cliam and shows the Penalty for allowing A Balot known to be Fraudently Marked to be placed in the Balot Box , to be not less than One Hundred Dollars etc. This also holds good for permitting or sanction the Counting of Ballots contrary to Law.

Betting is known to be illegal, accordingly this Board goes on record as being opposed to any Election Official placing any Bets on any results from any Election at which they are serving as Officials.

Pains in folding the Ballot for the Voter is just as important as that the Voter use care in refolding correctly according to the Card of Instructions which shpuld be well placed in each Booth.
